and Pacific families may help to reduce inequalities.

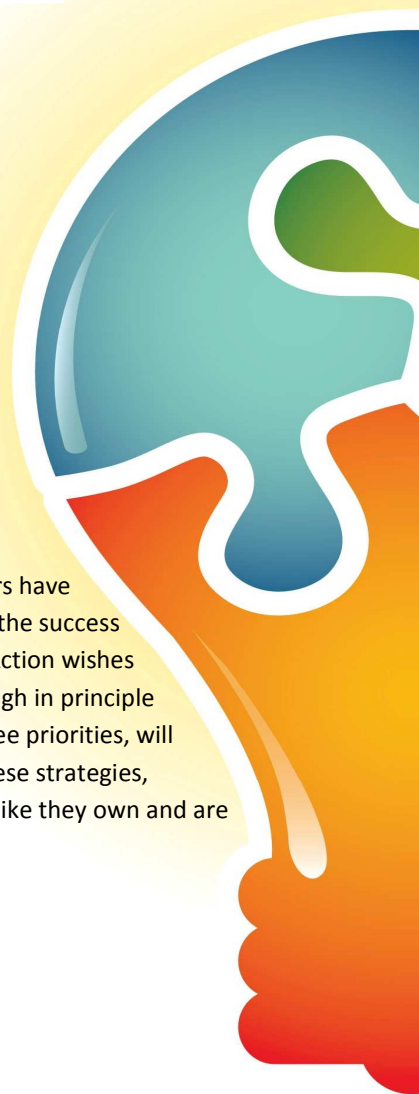
INTRODUCING OUR NEW MC...
